Library Trustees Meeting

November 8, 2023

Present: Hannah Paessel, Director; Chris Condit, Judith Davidov, Rachel Flint, Joan Godsey, Seth Seeger, Lisa Sullivan-Werner, Kathy Weller (Friends of the Leverett Library)

Approval of October 11th meeting minutes: Seth motioned to approve, Rachel seconded.

Trustee Business:

Budget Priorities FY24: Addition of a part-time Programming Librarian (See attachment for benefits, costs, comparison with other local libraries.)

- Despite increased staff to work at the circulation desk, the duties of the library director extend beyond the 25 hours per week of the position. This is particularly due to the time it takes to properly plan, advertise, deliver, and evaluate the large number of programs that the community needs and expects.
- The addition of a programming librarian would allow these programs to have the attention they deserve and for the library director to refocus on other duties, including writing and supporting grants."
- As Leverett residents describe the library, we are "the town's living room." Some 35 to 100 people visit the library per day in a 5-hour span. Hannah gives each one of them as much time as she can, but she needs more time to work, and library patrons need more attention.
- What Hannah cannot at presently do: entertain requests for community room use after hours; attend the meetings of the Friends of the Library and necessary staff meetings; attend to patrons' technical needs.

Holiday gifts for staff and volunteers: Joan will purchase gifts, she and Georgie will wrap them, and we (the trustees) will split the cost.

Updates:

Building:

- In process: scheduling an energy audit of all town buildings
- Building repair, a master carpenter in Leverett recommends gutters (to avoid rotting of two window sashes) and some siding. New gutters would go where building corners meet.

Grounds:

- Spoke w/ Matt re: outdoor expansion. He doesn't see any particular problems with repurposing the wildflower gardens and will come to planning meetings.
- Paving scheduled for spring 2024
- Preliminary Conway student presentation on Friday 11/17. Joan will attend.
- Patron has offered to donate a bench (w/ name on it) for the patio. More
 information is needed. In general, we think that this gift should be coordinated
 with the Friends' plan for outdoor expansion.

Follow-up: MA Legislative Bills to support libraries: Hannah has made available the links to the hearings; she especially pointed out provisions that would make electronic resources less expensive, and that the Freedom to Read bill would require libraries to adopt it in order to receive state aid.

The library was understaffed for the # of visitors & programs. Even full-time Directors were stretched to fulfill programming functions according to a 16 year employee.


